


All Prices in This Catalog Are Net and Subject to Change Without Notice

All orders for banners, badges, or any goods with name and number of Lodge engraved or printed thereon, or goods made to order, must be accompanied by at least one-fourth cash. Such goods can not be returned if they are as represented and order has been filled correctly.

All other goods sent on approval if ordered under seal of Lodge, or if order is signed by a committee of three who have been appointed and authorized to purchase, provided persons ordering agree to prepay express or freight charges in case goods are returned. Unless these conditions are complied with, goods will be shipped C. O. D., subject to examination.

If goods are to be sent by mail, proper allowance must be made for postage and amount included when remittance accompanies the order. Surplus postage will be returned. We make this requirement in order to obviate the necessity of opening accounts for very small amounts.

We make no charge for boxing or drayage.

We cannot stand responsible for delays of freight shipments. Freight is usually uncertain and can not be depended upon, therefore we recommend that all goods, except furniture and heavy paraphernalia, be shipped by express, or insured parcel post.

#### To Aid in Putting Life and Pep Into Your Side Degree Work

LOTS OF NOISE AND ACTION—that's what makes side-degree work interesting. As noise producers use; Spankers (page 71); Rattlers (page 100); Rickety-rackety and Rooters (page 100); Wind Machine (page 99); Rain Box and Thunder Sheet (page 102). Keep things moving—fast and furious—something doing every minute—that's what the members enjoy.

BURLESQUE COSTUMES—Dress the candidates in burlesque costumes. You will find this a mighty amusing feature of the initiation. We list a great variety of costumes, making it possible for you to have many different characters and natinoalities represented by the candidates. The greater the variety the greater the fun. Try it. See pages 125-138.

ZOBO BAND-Made up of candidates dressed in burlesque costumes. See pages 103 for instruments; pages 125-138 for costumes.

PARADE OF CANDIDATES—Representing animals, funny characters, celebrities, etc. Use camel, elephant, horse, donkey, etc., with two men inside; large animal and human heads; burlesque and race costumes, etc. See pages 123-138.

ROPE CLIMBING CONTEST—Use large size electric carpent. Suspend large rope from ceiling to hang over center of carpet. Several candidates are brought in, barefooted and hoodwinked, and commanded to take hold of the rope, which they are to start climbing when the attendant counts three. At "three" turn on the juice and watch them climb.

WRESTLING CONTEST—Have eight or ten candidates lie down on large electric carpet. in pairs, with arms around each other. Count three, turn on the juice and witness the liveliest wrestling match you ever saw or read about.

HOT SPOTS—Make the candidates step lively by having a number of "hot" spots around the hall. This can be arranged in various ways. Have a series of small electric carpets. A long run-way of white or brown duck with electric spots in it concealed. A run-way with connections so the current can be shot to any place desired. A covering for the entire hall with series of small electric mats under the cover. Tell us what arrangement you want or what results you wish to produce and we'll work out the details for you.

CHI-RO-GYM-NAS-TICS—After candidate has undergone several severe tests his condition may call for a little chiro treatment. Place electric carpet on table, with a sheet over the carpet. Place candidate on table, on his stomach, his head off the table. After the doctor has "tickled" his backbone a little, turn on the juice. Candidate will leave the table posthaste and thoroughly revived.

HOW DRY I AM—Suspend a paper sack of water from the ceiling. Place a table under the sack and have several candidates seated around the table to be served with drinks. They are first required to demonstrate their vocal ability and some one suggests that they sing "How Dry I Am." After they have sung a few lines release the sack and—splash—down comes the water on the table. It's quite a surprise for the candidates. This stunt can be made more "effective" by placing the table and chairs on a large electric carpet and giving the candidates the juice just as the sack hits the table.

PRESENTATION RING—The fellows will get up and dig when there is some incentive—a prize to be won. Announce that the winner of some contest will be presented with a nice (give name of organization) ring. The winner is escorted to the station of the presiding officer, where he is presented with the ring which consists of a loud rap on a gong. For gongs and strikers see page 160.

DEVIL CHASING THE CANDIDATES—Have one of the candidates dressed in devil costume, armed with a portable battery and electric cane. Dress the candidates in burlesque costumes. Let the devil chase the candidates into and around the hall, goading them with the electric cane. See page 47.

#### A LOW-DOWN BUCK



We thought we had about reached the limit when it came to inventing goats, but out of the realm of our imagination and ingenuity we have produced another specimen of the goat family. Though probably more applicable to his construction than to his conduct, yet we believe this animal is deserving of the title "A Low-Down Buck".

This goat is entirely different from any other we have ever invented—different not only in construction but in action as well. The action is not mechanical but is produced by the man at the handle, and he can sure make it rough for the candidate. As the weight is all on and directly over the large wheel, the goat is light on his feet and very easy to manipulate. The four small wheels keep the goat "right side up".

Only the large wheel runs on the floor. The small wheels might be compared to the four hoofs of a goat in action—they hit the floor, occasionally. When this goat is hustled into the hall, these four wheels produce a clatter that sounds like a gallopin' horse, and the candidate does not have to work his imagination overtime to believe that he is to be given a ride on a real live prancin' steed.

We haven't space here to tell about all the good (?) points of this goat and how he will perform, but we do say that your Lodge will find him to be a rip snorter. No matter what experience you might have had with other goats, you cannot afford to miss the big show which this low-down buck will produce.

#### THE ROLLICKING MUSTANG GOAT



One way to get the candidate's goat is to watch where he ties it. A better way is to give him a ride on this rollicking, frolicking mustang. When it comes to kicking, bucking, wabbling, rearing and other antics peculiar to the goat family, this mustang has 'em all beat. The eccentric front wheel serves as a safeguard against the candidate taking a "header" but does not rest on the floor except when "Billy" takes a notion to buck. Then the handle-bar is raised until the frame runs on all three wheels. As the hubs are out of center, the irregular motions produced are indeed very realistic and characteristic of the goat family. The peculiar arrangement of wheels and the strong spiral spring pivoted to body, together with the up-and-down motion of the handle-bar, produce the desired results. #### TRICK BOTTOM CHAIR



Even the floor will rise up to greet the candidate; at least that is the impression he gets when the bottom of this chair suddenly drops from under him. And if, as we understand it, an impression means a dent in a soft place, we are inclined to believe that the impression will be well defined.

The Candidate always welcomes an opportunity to sit down and rest. This chair will look mighty good to him, especially after he has become fatigued from other tests. He sees himself, comfortably seated here and watching the other candidates get what's coming to them. But, alas, he suddenly starts on a quick descent to the lower abyss of chaos, until the floor offers resistance to his impetuous precipitation.



#### TRICK CHAIRS

Down He Goes!



What goes up must come down. This old adage can be forcibly impressed upon the candidate by the use of this trick chair in connection with the electric chair shown on page 18. He will be thoroughly convinced that life is a see-saw of ups and downs.

The trick chair is made of oak, nicely finished and upholstered to represent a parlor chair. It may be used as an ordinary chair by a locking device which prevents it from falling. At the will of the attendant the legs automatically separate, the chair collapses, and a blank cartridge is exploded. Imagine the candidate's surprise when, after picking himself up, he looks around and finds the chair standing just as it was before he took a seat. The mechanical or trick part of chair is operated by the best tempered steel springs.


This electric chair is one of our latest and best inventions. It is arranged with electric battery concealed beneath the seat. An important and attractive feature is the switch, which can be turned off so that no shock is received by the person sitting on the chair. The switch can be turned on and off without the knowledge of those whom it is desired to "catch." A good plan is to post a few members who are to sit on the chair when the switch is off. Then along comes a member or candidate who is not next to the scheme. He takes a seat and he gets it good and plenty, and he wonders how in the world he happened to get stung when others sat on the chair without any "emotion" whatever. The chair is a positive deceiver and never fails to work at the proper time. It may be placed anywhere in the lodge room and any member as well as a candidate, can be made a "victim".

#### A POINTED AFFAIR

Some times when a candidate cannot see the point he might be excused for refusing to yield in an argument. In this case the "points" are very clear, yet it only makes him remonstrate all the more. But if he carries the argument too far, the points involved might be driven home by forcibly seating him upon what appears to be sharp-pointed spikes. Naturally the candidate is not very keen about having his anatomy punctured. It may tax the physical ability of several attendants to clinch the argument, but—how silly the candidate will look when he finds that the thing is perfectly harmless.

#### BOMB STUNT



This harmless though highly exciting ceremony will not encourage the bolshevik spirit or the bomb-throwing habit. On the contrary, it will teach the candidate not to fool with bombs and infernal machines.

This stunt consists of a chair, fake bomb and garbage can. The chair is arranged to fire a blank cartridge and turn on electric current at the same time, any jump spark battery being used. The bomb is an iron ball with a fuse which does a good deal of sputtering when lighted but throws off no sparks. The can is made with a firing device on the inside which explodes a blank cartridge.

Candidate is seated on the chair and the lighted bomb is handed him by a bolshevik or attendant, or candidate might be compelled to light the bomb himself. Of course, he expects the infernal machine to go off and he can be made to believe it has, any time the attendant sees fit to shoot on the juice and fire the cartridge. The attendant then suggests that he throw the bomb into the garbage can, and this strikes the candidate as being a good way out of his precarious situation. As he raises the lid and is in the act of throwing in the bomb, the explosion in the can occurs, and candidate thanks his stars that he got rid of the bomb just in time to escape being blown into atoms.
